It was first published in 1984 and contains short articles and notices of research in progress on the history of Market Harborough and the forty or so parishes within ten miles of the town (which forms the collection area of the Harborough Museum).

The Market Harborough Historical Society was founded in 1931 and has been active ever since as a forum for those interested in history and archaeology of the area. The society holds a series of lectures every winter and spring and organises a number of excursions to places of interest during the rest of the year. Membership details are available from the Secretary, (c/o the Harborough Museum).

The Harborough Museum is a partnership between the Market Harborough Historical Society, Harborough District Council and Leicestershire County Council. The Society's collection of artefacts and photographs formed the basis of the Harborough Museum when it opened in 1983. The Museum collects, displays and interprets the artefacts and history of the Harborough area.
